Historical background

Does the royal family have a future in modern Britain?

HISTORY

- → all-powerful monarch until English Civil War → political head of the country
- \rightarrow parliamentarians \rightarrow won the Civil War \rightarrow executed Charles 1
- > monarchy restored in 1660, but parliamentary powers now limited
- → monarch as religious leader → Henry VIII breaks with Rome to establish himself as the head of the Church of England

MODERNISING THE MONARCHY

- → reduction in number of working royals → fewer receive public funding
- > use of social media to connect with the people
- > younger royals speak very openly about issues e.g. mental health
- > meeting with all kinds of different people → connecting on a personal level

MONARCHY: FOR AND AGAINST

- > neutral; not linked to a political party
- > continuity; part of British culture
- > good for the country & economy
- works hard for British interests

Against:

- non-elected head of state is undemocratic
- > too expensive
- > out of touch with ordinary people
- > reinforces concept of elitist society
