HISTORY

- all-powerful monarch until English Civil War → political head of the country
- parliamentarians → won the Civil War → executed Charles I
- monarchy restored in 1660, but parliamentary powers now limited
- monarch as religious leader → Henry VIII breaks with Rome to establish himself as the head of the Church of England

MODERNISING THE MONARCHY

- reduction in number of working royals → fewer receive public funding
- use of social media to connect with the people
- younger royals speak very openly about issues e.g. mental health
- meeting with all kinds of different people → connecting on a personal level

MONARCHY: FOR AND AGAINST

For:

- neutral; not linked to a political party
- continuity; part of British culture
- good for the country & economy
- works hard for British interests

Against:

- non-elected head of state is undemocratic
- too expensive
- out of touch with ordinary people
- reinforces concept of elitist society
